### Notes on Kinds of Sentences



<b>DECLARATIVE</b>	Function: Makes a statement. It ends with a period.	The assignment is due tomorrow.
<b>INTERROGATIVE</b>	Function: Asks a question. It ends with a question mark.	Do you know what time class starts?
<b>IMPERATIVE</b>	Function: Gives a command or makes a request. It ends with a period.	Hand it in now.
<b>EXCLAMATORY</b>	Function: Expresses strong feeling. It ends with an exclamation mark.	How beautiful your handwriting looks!

Using the different kinds of sentences will add variety to your writing.

Hint: Most imperative sentences will start with a verb to indicate your command or request:

Examples:

Declarative sentence: You should find someone who can tell you all about birds.

Imperative sentence: Find someone who can tell you all about birds.

Declarative sentence: You need to exercise daily to keep yourself healthy.

Imperative sentence: Exercise daily to keep yourself healthy.
